announces a competitive selection process for the post of an ASSISTANT PROFESSOR

in the research staff member group

at the Copernicus Center of Interdisciplinary Studies of the Jagiellonian University

academic discipline:

psychology or biological sciences, computer and information sciences or philosophy, linguistics in the domain of mind and cognition research

Duration of the contract: 30 months

The competitive selection process is open for all individuals, who meet the requirements set out in Articles 113 and 116.2.3) of the Act of 20 July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science, and who meet the following eligibility criteria according to § 165 of the Statute of the Jagiellonian University:

- 1) Holding at least a doctoral degree;
- 2) Having relevant scientific achievements at the international level in terms of: books and/or papers in prestigious scientific journals, and participation in scientific conferences on broadly understood issues of mind and cognition;
- 3) Taking active part in scientific life;

Additionally:

- the candidate should declare readiness to conduct research on mind and cognition, in particular the processing of abstract concepts, and/or spatial navigation, and/or evolution of cognition,
- the candidate presents a plan of her/his mind and cognition research, which she/he intends to implement during the period of employment,
- the candidate is well familiar with at least one research methodology used in mind and cognition research (e.g., behavioral experiments, VR, neuroimaging, computational modeling, philosophical analysis,
- the candidate has experience in interdisciplinary research practice,
- the candidate has experience in organizational and project work, in particular in the implementation of research projects financed from external sources by way of a competition (e.g., grant agencies),
- the candidate has experience in international academic cooperation with individual scientists and/or research institutions,
- the doctoral degree should be obtained no earlier than 7 years before 1.10.2020; the specified period of 7 years does not include periods of maternity leave, paternity leave, parental leave in terms of Polish law (i.e., 'Kodeks pracy,' June 26, 1974), or periods of receiving an allowance maternity benefit or parental benefit, or periods of sickness benefit or rehabilitation benefit due to incapacity for work, including those caused by a disease requiring therapeutic rehabilitation.

- 2. a declaration of will to conduct mind and cognition research along with a specified research plan,
- 3. CV including: a publications and conferences record, a list of awards and distinctions, a list of internships and stays in academic institutions, a list of completed and ongoing research projects (as a PI or researcher/investigator) with an indication of funding sources; the candidate should emphasize three publications which she/he considers the most important in her/his career;

- 5. copy of the doctoral diploma or a diploma confirming the candidate's habilitation degree, if applicable;

Personal data processing information for job applicants

According to Article 13 of the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation – hereinafter GDPR), the Jagiellonian University informs that:

- 1. The Administrator of your personal data is the Jagiellonian University with its registered office in Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, respresented by the Rector of UJ.

- 3. Your personal data will be processed in order to:
 - a. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in the advertisement "competitive selection process for the post of an ASSISTANT PROFESSOR in the research staff member group at the Copernicus Center of Interdisciplinary Studies of the Jagiellonian University" as part of the legal obligation of the Administrator pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR in connection with the Polish Labour Code;
 - b. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in the advertisement "competitive selection process for the post of an ASSISTANT PROFESSOR in the research staff member group at the Copernicus Center of Interdisciplinary Studies of the Jagiellonian University" based on your consent pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR your consent is granted by the clear action of submitting your CV with the Administrator. The consent to the processing of personal data concerns data that you voluntarily provide as part of your CV, which do not result from Polish Labour Code.
- 4. The obligation to provide your personal data results from the law (it applies to personal data processed under Article 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR). Failure to provide you personal data will result in your inability to take part in the recruitment process. Submission of personal data processed on the basis of consent (Article 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR) is voluntary.
- 5. Your data will be processed during the recruitment period. In the event of not concluding the contract with you, your data will be deleted after the recruitment process.
- 6. You have the right of access to the content of your personal data, as well as the right to correct, delete, restrict processing, transfer, object to processing on the terms and conditions set out in the GDPR.
- 7. If the processing is based on consent, you have the right to withdraw the consent at any time, which shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on the consent given before the withdrawal.
