**THE RECTOR
of the Jagiellonian University
announces a call for the position
of ASSISTANT PROFESSOR
in a group of researchers
at the Faculty of Law and Administration
in the field of legal science**

**in the area of relations between law and cognitive sciences, with particular emphasis on research on legal language
or legal reasoning**

The call is open to persons who meet the conditions set out in Article 113 and Article 116 s 2 item 3 of the Act of 20 July 2018 – the Law on Higher Education and Science and, pursuant to Article 165 of the Statute of the Jagiellonian University, meet the following qualification criteria:

1. hold at minimum a doctoral degree,
2. take an active part in scientific life,
3. have relevant scientific achievements.

Candidate assessment criteria:

1. the quality of a candidate's scientific achievements (in particular publications) and the correlation of their achievements and research interests with the subject of the call (relations between law and cognitive sciences, with particular emphasis on research on legal language or legal reasoning),
2. experience in international academic cooperation,
3. experience in interdisciplinary scientific work or additional education in the field of cognitive sciences,
4. experience in organizational and project work, in particular in the implementation of projects financed from external sources,
5. experience in popularization of science and innovative education,
6. experience in cooperation with entities outside the academia (schools, government, NGOs, companies, media etc.),
7. fluency in English,
8. the quality of the presented research plan concerning relations between law and cognitive sciences, with particular emphasis on research on legal language or legal reasoning.

Expectations:

1. implementation of the presented research plan in cooperation with the Future Law Lab team,
2. over the course of employment, submitting (as the first author) a minimum of two articles for journals that are rated at least at 100 points on the list of the Ministry of Education and Science, or one such article and a book proposal for a publisher listed on the 2nd level of the list of the Ministry of Education and Science,
3. contribution to the activities of FLL, the Faculty and Society of the Future PRA, in particular: active participation in seminars, conferences and projects, popularization of science (in the form of open lectures, popular science texts,

co-authorship of MOOCs, etc.), cooperation with entities outside the academia (e.g. by contributing expert opinions), networking activities.

We offer:

1. base salary and allowance,
2. a fixed-term employment contract of 30 months,
3. access to a research fund under the Future Law Lab, in particular for travel for the purpose of research, participation in conferences, seminars, workshops and trainings, purchase of literature, hardware and software, as well as research and publication costs.

Applicants shall send by email to futurelawlab@uj.edu.pl the following documents:

1. application for employment,
2. a plan of research to be carried out during the employment period on relations between law and cognitive sciences, with particular emphasis on research on legal language or legal reasoning, taking into account the matter of academic cooperation (especially international), popularization of science and cooperation with entities outside the academia (in English, up to 10,000 characters with spaces),
3. a resume containing, in particular, information on the completed education, professional experience, and knowledge of foreign languages, a list of awards and distinctions, a list of internships and residences in research institutions, and a list of completed and ongoing research projects (as a principal investigator or an investigator) with an indication of the sources of funding and the role thereof,
4. a list of publications with the date of publication, the name, volume and issue of the journal or the name of the publisher, number of pages and, if applicable, co-authorship,
5. a description of the candidate's scientific achievements with the indication of the four most important publications and the two most important presentations at international conferences, and a description of the most important achievements in the field of international academic cooperation, interdisciplinary research, organizational and project work, popularization of science, and cooperation with entities outside the academia (in English, up to 10,000 characters with spaces),
6. two letters of recommendation,
7. a copy of the doctoral or habilitation diploma, if applicable,
8. reviews of a doctoral dissertation or habilitation thesis, if applicable,
9. a document of the last periodic evaluation from the previous workplace, if the candidate has undergone such an evaluation,
10. a personal data form for the person applying for employment,
11. a declaration that the Jagiellonian University will be the primary place of employment in the event of the candidate being employed,
12. a declaration pursuant to Article 113 of the Law on Higher Education and Science,
13. a declaration of the knowledge and acceptance of the principles of intellectual property management and the principles of commercialization of the Jagiellonian University,
14. a signed personal data processing information.

Personal data processing information for job applicants

According to Article 13 of the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation – hereinafter GDPR), the Jagiellonian University informs that:

1. The Administrator of your personal data is the Jagiellonian University with its registered office in Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, respresented by the Rector of UJ.
2. The Jagiellonian University appointed the Data Protection Officer www.iod.uj.edu.pl, Gołębia 24, 30-007 Kraków. The Officer can be contacted by email: iod@uj.edu.pl or at the telephone number 12 663 12 25.
3. Your personal data will be processed in order to:
 - a. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in the specified advertisement – as part of the legal obligation of the Administrator pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR in connection with the Polish Labour Code;
 - b. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in the specified advertisement based on your consent pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR – your consent is granted by the clear action of submitting your CV with the Administrator. The consent to the processing of personal data concerns data that you voluntarily provide as part of your CV, which do not result from Polish Labour Code.
4. The obligation to provide your personal data results from the law (it applies to personal data processed under Article 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR). Failure to provide you personal data will result in your inability to take part in the recruitment process. Submission of personal data processed on the basis of consent (Article 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR) is voluntary.
5. Your data will be processed during the recruitment period. In the event of not concluding the contract with you, your data will be deleted after the recruitment process.
6. You have the right of access to the content of your personal data, as well as the right to correct, delete, restrict processing, transfer, object to processing – on the terms and conditions set out in the GDPR.
7. If the processing is based on consent, you have the right to withdraw the consent at any time, which shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on the consent given before the withdrawal.
