**THE RECTOR
of the Jagiellonian University
announces a call for the position
of POSTDOCTORAL RESEARCHER (assistant professor)
in a group of researchers
at the Faculty of Philosophy
in the field of psychology
in the Department of General Psychology
within the project “Un(learning) pain by consequences. Development of the learning theory of placebo effects”,
funded by National Science Center, MAESTRO 12 (PSP: K/PBN/000046)**

The call is open to persons who meet the conditions set out in Article 113, 116 s 2 item 3 of the Act of 20 July 2018 — the Law on Higher Education and Science and, pursuant to Article 165 of the Statute of the Jagiellonian University, meet the following qualification criteria:

- 1) hold at minimum a doctoral degree,
- 2) have relevant scientific achievements,
- 3) take an active part in scientific life.

The candidate should meet the following criteria:

- 1) is a scientist with a doctoral degree in the field of psychology or related sciences, obtained not earlier than 7 years before the start date of the call for the position of postdoctoral researcher (i.e., November 3, 2021),
- 2) has an experience in conducting psychological experimental research,
- 3) is the author or co-author of peer-reviewed publications, including publications indexed on the *Journal Citation Index* database,
- 4) is the author or co-author of presentations at international conferences,
- 5) has experience in statistical data analysis,
- 6) is fluent in English.

Duties include:

- 1) designing the studies,
- 2) designing the study materials and experimental procedures,
- 3) conducting experimental research,
- 4) conducting the statistical analysis,
- 5) interpretation of the results,

- 6) preparation of the publications and the conference presentations,
- 7) presentation of the results at the scientific conferences.
- 8) attendance in research team meetings.

The work will be primarily on-site; therefore, the presence of an employee at the Institute of Psychology of the Jagiellonian University is required. **The supervisor of the employee would be Prof. Przemysław Bąbel, the principal investigator of the project. 12. a declaration of the knowledge and acceptance of the principles of intellectual property management and the principles of commercialization of the Jagiellonian University,

Personal data processing information for job applicants

According to Article 13 of the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation – hereinafter GDPR), the Jagiellonian University informs that:

2. The Jagiellonian University appointed the Data Protection Officer www.iod.uj.edu.pl, Gołębia 24, 30-007 Kraków. The Officer can be contacted by email: iod@uj.edu.pl or at the telephone number 12 663 12 25.
3. Your personal data will be processed in order to:
 - a. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in this advertisement – as part of the legal obligation of the Administrator pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR in connection with the Polish Labour Code;
 - b. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in this advertisement based on your consent pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR – your consent is granted by the clear action of submitting your CV with the Administrator. The consent to the processing of personal data concerns data that you voluntarily provide as part of your CV, which do not result from Polish Labour Code.
4. The obligation to provide your personal data results from the law (it applies to personal data processed under Article 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR). Failure to provide your personal data will result in your inability to take part in the recruitment process. Submission of personal data processed on the basis of consent (Article 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR) is voluntary.
5. Your data will be processed during the recruitment period. In the event of not concluding the contract with you, your data will be deleted after the recruitment process.
6. You have the right of access to the content of your personal data, as well as the right to correct, delete, restrict processing, transfer, object to processing – on the terms and conditions set out in the GDPR.
7. If the processing is based on consent, you have the right to withdraw the consent at any time, which shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on the consent given before the withdrawal.
