RECTOR of the Jagiellonian University
announces a competitive selection process for the post of an ASSISTANT PROFESSOR
in the research staff member group
at the Copernicus Center for Interdisciplinary Studies of the Jagiellonian University
in one of the following disciplines:
psychology, education, biological sciences, computer and information sciences
in the domain of research on mathematical cognition and/or mathematics learning/education

Duration of the contract: 30 months

The competitive selection process is open for all individuals who meet the requirements set out in Articles 113 and 116.2.3) of the Act of 20 July 2018 – Polish Law on Higher Education and Science, and who meet the following eligibility criteria according to § 165 of the Statute of the Jagiellonian University:

- 1) Holding at least a doctoral degree (PhD);
- 2) Having relevant scientific achievements;
- 3) Taking active part in scientific life.

Specific requirements:

The candidate should:

- have a relevant publication record in terms of papers published in international peer-reviewed journals in the scope of experimental psychology and/or cognitive neuroscience and/or education sciences and/or computer and information sciences;
- have an excellent acquaintance of the methodology of behavioral research with the participation of humans and practical skills in this scope, starting with the programming of experimental procedures (e.g., PsychoPy, Inquisit, OpenSesame), through conducting experiments (experience in laboratory work), to statistical analysis (e.g., R Studio, SPSS, MathLab); experience in conducting research and analysis of psychophysiological/neuroscientific data and/or computational modeling and/or virtual reality experiments will be an added (but not compulsory) advantage to the candidate.
- have an experience in international academic cooperation (e.g., research stay during a doctorate, postdoctoral fellowship, collaboration with individual foreign scientists documented by joint publications); in the case of candidates who obtained their doctorate outside Poland, this condition is automatically met.
- have an experience in organizational and project work, in particular in managing or participating in research projects financed from external sources by way of a competition (e.g., state/national or international grant agencies, foundations supporting science, etc.);
- declare their willingness to conduct research on mathematical cognition and/or mathematics education/learning and present a research project that will be implemented during the period of employment (see below).

We offer:

- work in the newly established Mathematical Cognition and Learning Lab (<https://mcll.edu.pl>; principal investigator: Dr. habil. Mateusz Hohol, Prof. UJ); the Lab is funded as a Flagship Project of the Excellence Initiative – Jagiellonian University program and is part of Copernicus Center for Interdisciplinary Research of the Jagiellonian University. The Lab collaborates closely with the Institute of Psychology, the Institute of Education (the Faculty of Philosophy of JU), and the Centre for Brain Research of JU;
- full-time research position of assistant professor without teaching duties;
- a fixed-term employment contract for 30 months;
- access to funds for the research project;

6. Copy of the doctoral (Ph.D.) diploma or a diploma confirming the candidate's habilitation degree, if applicable;
7. Reviews of a doctoral dissertation or habilitation thesis – if the candidate has one;
8. The last periodic evaluation form, if the candidate was subject to such evaluation;
9. Declaration of the candidate, confirming that the Jagiellonian University will be their primary place of work in the case of being selected in the competitive selection process *;
10. Declaration under Article 113 of the Law on Higher Education and Science *;
11. Declaration on acknowledging and accepting the rules and regulations concerning intellectual property management*;
12. Information regarding processing of personal data *;
13. Declaration of intent to conduct research on mathematical cognition and/or mathematics education/learning and a project of this research; Note: the research project should be prepared in English in the form of 5–10 pages of standardized text (Times New Roman, font 12, spacing 1.5) and include a reference to the current state of research, research hypotheses, planned methods (including statistical analyses or simulations), the scope of the planned work divided into tasks over time, and assumed publication goals.

Personal data processing information for job applicants

According to Article 13 of the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation – hereinafter GDPR), the Jagiellonian University informs that:

3. Your personal data will be processed in order to:
 - a. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in the above advertisement – as part of the legal obligation of the Administrator pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR in connection with the Polish Labour Code;
 - b. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in the above advertisement based on your consent pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR – your consent is granted by the clear action of submitting your CV with the Administrator. The consent to the processing of personal data concerns data that you voluntarily provide as part of your CV, which do not result from Polish Labour Code.
4. The obligation to provide your personal data results from the law (it applies to personal data processed under Article 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR). Failure to provide you personal data will result in your inability to take part in the recruitment process. Submission of personal data processed on the basis of consent (Article 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR) is voluntary.
5. Your data will be processed during the recruitment period. In the event of not concluding the contract with you, your data will be deleted after the recruitment process.
6. You have the right of access to the content of your personal data, as well as the right to correct, delete, restrict processing, transfer, object to processing – on the terms and conditions set out in the GDPR.
