announces a competitive selection process for the post of an
ASSISTANT PROFESSOR
in the research staff**

at the Theoretical Computer Science Department
of the Faculty of Mathematics and Computer Science
academic field: mathematics or computer science

The competitive selection process is open for all individuals, who meet the requirements set out in Articles 113 and 116.2.3 of the Act of 20 July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science, and who meet the following eligibility criteria according to § 165 of the Statute of the Jagiellonian University:

- 1) Holding at least a doctoral degree;
- 2) Having relevant scientific achievements;
- 3) Taking active part in scientific life.

Additionally:

- 4) A doctoral degree received in 2015¹ or later;
- 5) According to attachment of resolution 60/2019 of the Council of the NCN: a candidate was not employed at the Jagiellonian University within last two years before starting the job at the announced position.

The postdoctoral position is funded by the SONATA BIS 9 project “Colorings, cliques, and independent sets in graph classes” (principal investigator: Prof. Bartosz Walczak). The duration of employment is **between 6 and 12 months** (up to agreement with the principal investigator) with a possibility of extension to the maximum of 36 months. The starting date can be any time between October 1, 2022 and November 1, 2022 up to agreement with the principal investigator. The position comes with no teaching obligations. The selected candidate will work on problems in combinatorial and algorithmic graph theory.

The applying candidates should submit the following documents to the email address **bartosz.walczak@uj.edu.pl**:

1. signed cover letter;
2. CV, including information on the candidate’s scientific, teaching and organisational achievements; and also including a list of publications;
3. personal questionnaire form filled in by the candidate;
4. copy of the doctoral diploma or a diploma confirming the candidate’s habilitation degree, if applicable;
5. two or three reference letters from experienced researchers for the candidate;
6. declaration of the candidate, confirming that the Jagiellonian University will be their primary place of work, should they be selected in the competitive selection process;²
7. declaration under Article 113 of the Law on Higher Education and Science;
8. declaration on acknowledging and accepting the rules and regulations concerning intellectual property management and commercialisation in force at the Jagiellonian University;
9. information regarding processing of personal data.

Personal data processing information for job applicants

According to Article 13 of the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation – hereinafter GDPR), the Jagiellonian University informs that:

1. The Administrator of your personal data is the Jagiellonian University with its registered office in Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, represented by the Rector of UJ.
2. The Jagiellonian University appointed the Data Protection Officer www.iod.uj.edu.pl, Gołębia 24, 30-007 Kraków. The Officer can be contacted by email: iod@uj.edu.pl or at the telephone number 12 663 12 25.
3. Your personal data will be processed in order to:
 - a. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in the advertisement – as part of the legal obligation of the Administrator pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR in connection with the Polish Labour Code;
 - b. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in the advertisement based on your consent pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR – your consent is granted by the clear action of submitting your CV with the Administrator. The consent to the processing of personal data concerns data that you voluntarily provide as part of your CV, which do not result from Polish Labour Code.
4. The obligation to provide your personal data results from the law (it applies to personal data processed under Article 6 (1) lit c of the GDPR). Failure to provide you personal data will result in your inability to take part in the recruitment process. Submission of personal data processed on the basis of consent (Article 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR) is voluntary.
5. Your data will be processed during the recruitment period. In the event of not concluding the contract with you, your data will be deleted after the recruitment process.
6. You have the right of access to the content of your personal data, as well as the right to correct, delete, restrict processing, transfer, object to processing – on the terms and conditions set out in the GDPR.
7. If the processing is based on consent, you have the right to withdraw the consent at any time, which shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on the consent given before the withdrawal. 8. Your personal data will not be subject to automated decision making or profiling.
9. You have the right to lodge a complaint with the Inspector General for the Protection of Personal Data, if you feel that the processing of your personal data violates the GDPR regulations.
