within the scope of research project Horizon Europe
Alliance for Research on Cultural Heritage in Europe – ARCHE

The competitive selection process is open for all individuals, who meet the requirements set out in Articles 113 and 116.2.4) of the Act of 20 July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science, and who meet the following eligibility criteria according to § 166 of the Statute of the Jagiellonian University:

- 1) Holding at least a Master's degree, Master of Science degree or an equivalent degree;
- 2) Exhibiting aptitude for research work;

Additional criteria resulting from the project:

- hold at least the degree of magister, magister inzynier or an equivalent degree in broadly defined 'heritage studies' (i. e. in one of the relevant academic disciplines: sciences in cultures and religions, history, sociology, literary studies and others),
- prepared at least an outstanding magister degree thesis confirmed by opinion of academic tutor or thesis confirmed by high grade,
- English language proficiency is required. If you are not a native English speaker, or if the language of instruction at your previous university was not English, we will ask you to provide evidence of strong English language skills. Please include English language test results in your application if this applies to you,
- Very strong knowledge of French language is essential, as well. If you are not a native French speaker, or if the
 language of instruction at your previous university was not French, we will ask you to provide evidence of
 strong French language skills. Please include French language test results in your application if this applies to
 you,
- Certified knowledge of other European language will be a strong assent of the candidate,
- General knowledge of the theory of heritage and its practical implementation in social-economic life,
- Previous and certified strong experience in managing international research projects (NCN, Horizon, ERC projects etc.) and international consortia and academic networks,
- strong academic record.

Beginning, length of contract and % of full-time

Starting date: 1 October 2022

The position is 50% time during 18 month and 25% time during next 12 month without teaching obligations.

Mission of the project

The project will develop the Alliance for Research on Cultural Heritage in Europe (ARCHE), a spearheading coordination network of researchers, innovators, heritage professionals and institutional bodies.

Organization of the position

Placed under the administrative authority of the leader of the project at the Jagiellonian University, the employed postdoc researcher of the ARCHE will work in close collaboration with the partners of the ARCHE project and in particular the coordinator (Fondation du Patrimoine, Paris) and the second university partner of the project (Université Paris 1 Panthéon Sorbonne). He/she will also collaborate with the Self-Steering Committee on Cultural Heritage of Una Europa.

The job description

The recruited post-doc will participate to the WP 1, 2, 4 and 6 of the ARCHE project. His/her main tasks will be:

- 1. Extensive investigation (WP1) to identify current activities offering perspectives for joint action by mainly Central European EU member states / associated countries, in order to identify research and innovation domains with European added value that would justify future activities. Methodology: desk research and interviews.
- 2. Detailed analysis of current needs deriving from the mapping of the actions in the cultural heritage sector and its assessment (analysis consisting of desk-based research gathering: i) existing studies relevant to cultural heritage, including arts and cultural and creative sectors [CCS] in mainly Central European countries; and ii) existing analysis on research strategies, future & emerging technologies, FET).
- 3. Participation to the SWOT analysis and visioning to develop a shared vision and mission of ARCHE and the key trends and recommendations for the ARCHE Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda (ARCHE SRIA)
- 4. Proposal of new ways to engage stakeholders, users of cultural heritage and the arts, actors of civil society and, in particular, the younger generation with cultural heritage and its role in shaping the perception of European societies as well as a European sense of belonging.
- 5. Proposals for building ARCHE: development plan and negotiation with new partners in the ARCHE alliance.

- 9. declaration of the candidate, confirming that the Jagiellonian University will be their primary place of work, should they be selected in the competitive selection process;
- 10. declaration under Article 113 of the Law on Higher Education and Science;
- 11. declaration on acknowledging and accepting the rules and regulations concerning intellectual property management and commercialisation in force at the Jagiellonian University;

 - b. conduct recruitment process for the position specified in this advertisement based on your consent pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit a of the GDPR your consent is granted by the clear action of submitting your CV with the Administrator.
