Project Title

NAWA "Polish Returns 2019": "Reactive oxygen species and autophagy in *Staphyloccocus aureus* infection" – double-edged swords?" K/PBI/000146

Program / Project description

The position of research assistant professor ("post-doc") funded by the National Agency for Academic Exchange (NAWA) is held at the Department of Evolutionary Immunology of the Jagiellonian University, Faculty of Biology. The post-doc will join the group led by Dr. Tomasz Prajsnar, who studies infectious diseases with particular emphasis on the *Staphylococcus aureus*. The position is offered for a period of 9 months.

The aim of the project is to investigate the involvement of reactive oxygen species and autophagy in the responses of human immune cells during *S. aureus* infection. The post-doc will use a cell sorter (FACS) and confocal microscopy to analyze the mechanisms governing intracellular infection caused by staphylococci. Additionally, the position will include assistance in supervising doctoral and master's students associated with the project, as well as data analysis and manuscript preparation.
